

WELCOME!

Again this year, the Chester Church of Christ Summer Bible Camp offers you a fun filled week of camping. The camp is staffed with Christian men and women. The week will be filled with spiritual growth, fellowship, and loads of fun. Campers have the opportunity to form meaningful relationships that will follow them for a lifetime.

This camp has been overseen by the Elders of the Chester Church for many years. Hundreds of young people have many Christian memories from this scenic state park in the northern panhandle of West Virginia.

WHEN YOU ARRIVE!

Check in and registration for the week will start at 4:00pm till 5:30pm Monday in the dining hall. Cabin assignments will be made at this time. Please make every effort to arrive during this period. Check out will be Saturday at 8:00am.

WHAT TO BRING!

Bible, pencil and notebook, needed toiletries, towels and washcloth, pillow, sleeping bag or blanket, light jacket or sweatshirt, flashlight, small fan, snacks.

Many campers like to decorate their cabins with a variety of things, so if you have any ideas that you can make your cabin feel like home, then bring it and spruce up your living quarters, as long as you do no damage to the cabin by what you put up.

No air conditioners or small refrigerators are permitted, due to the limited number of outlets and electric supply.

HEALTH AND DRESS!

We take all precautions to ensure the health and safety of all campers. Nurses are on staff all week to attend to those in need of minor attention. Well balanced meals are prepared each day for the campers and staff.

All campers should wear clothing suitable for camping, being dressed modestly at all times. Do NOT bring any clothing that could be offensive to anyone. If you wear such articles, you will be kindly asked to change. Not doing so, will be cause for removal from the camp and sent home with no refund.

HEALTH AND SAFETY!

While every effort will be made to ensure safety and well being, it is important that parents of campers remind their children to follow instructions of the counselors and director. Any medical expenses that may occur as a result of sickness or injury are the responsibility of the parent or legal guardian. One of these signatures must be on the registration form before the camper may stay.

ATTENDANCE POLICY!

Young people ages 9 through 17 are welcome to attend. Campers and staff work, play, laugh, pray and worship God together during the week. Bible classes, a Bible Bee, and evening worship are mandatory each day. There should also be personal Bible study and evening devotionals daily. Participation in all other activities is greatly encouraged.

CAMP ACTIVITIES!

Along with great meals and Bible classes each day, various events such as sports, crafts, swimming, games, walks, campfire, and indoor activities are planned. Cooperation is requested during these programs. Water activities will require girls not to wear white shirts. You may be asked to participate in skit night. Cabins or groups of campers get together and demonstrate their acting skills about a Biblical topic chosen by their counselors or a theme determined by activities of the week.

An awards program is presented at the end of the week for displays of sportsmanship, cooperation, kindness and compassion. These awards are voted on by your fellow campers. There is a senior group as well as a junior group of awards. The Bible bee also brings recognition to those campers who have displayed knowledge and sincerity of paying attention during Bible classes, devotionals, and self study.

This is a Christian camp, with God being our reason for being here. Everyone will have the opportunity to hear the Words of Jesus proclaimed and to obey the commandments of the Lord. Counselors or the Director will always be willing to talk to you about Christ and how it affects your personal life and the decisions you make. There will never be any pressure put on a camper to obey the Gospel.

If at any time a problem should arise, feel free to talk to your counselor first, the Director if need be, and we will try our very best to work through whatever dilemma you might be facing. Hopefully this will be an enjoyable week for all involved in any way.

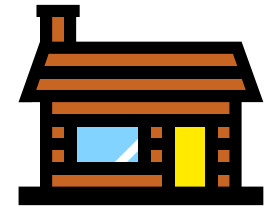

Located in the northern panhandle 15 miles north of Weirton on Rt. 2, Tomlinson Run State Park is easily accessible by taking WV Rt. 8 north to where it intersects with WV Rt. 2 at New Cumberland, and following the signs to the park just north of New Manchester, WV. Also located 5 miles south of where Rt. 8 intersects with Rt. 30 coming from Ohio or Pennsylvania.



Tomlinson Run State Park group camp contains 10 cabins that can accomodate up to 8 campers each and also a counselor cabin which can yield up to 12 counselors. A rustic dining hall as well as a large assembly hall are all located in short distances of each other.
