We have reduced the church to a counseling center helping people cope! God made the church a salvation center teaching people how to live. We do not merely need therapy—we need the WORD! We don't just need Bible scholars—we need Bible lovers! If you honor the Word, God will bless you!

You must read 2 Timothy 3:15-17. This bulletin will preach!

The Bible teaches us "How to be saved." Timothy, from the cradle, had been steeped in scripture. His teachers? Mama! Granny! Paul! The Word produces salvation. Why preach anything but Jesus? The Word allows us to minister as the Body in the body for the body. Spirituality is not individuality ... it is corporate. God calls us in the body. We must learn to be "We" before "I".
