Spurgeon said this verse revealed the best thing in the best place for the best purpose. Here it is seen where your Bible, and mine, need to be and why.

The best place for your Bible: In your heart, "Thy word have I hid in mine heart ..." Not merely in my house, my office, my book shelf, my hand, my head, but in my heart. This means in me - my mind, emotions, will, spirit - my very being. Note the Psalmist said he hid the word in his heart. He hid it, not to conceal it or place it out of sight, but to bury it deep within that part of man which controls actions. The Bible must get into our hearts before it gets into our lives. The teachings of the Bible need to be planted deeply, firmly, and regularly in our hearts. This why we need to continually take advantage of Bible classes, sermons, private Bible reading and study time, good Christian literature, gospel meetings, lectureships, and other ways which will help us get the Bible in our hearts.

The best purpose for hiding the Bible in your heart: "...that I might not sin against Thee." When Jesus was tempted, He showed how powerful the Scriptures are in thwarting temptation (Matthew 4:3-10). "It is written" is living power against sin!
