Whether it is a promise to repay twenty dollars or a vow to be faithful to one's marital partner, the promises and vows are too easily and quickly forgotten. The idea of remaining true NO MATTER WHAT is almost unheard of. The prevailing rule instead is "I want to do what I want to do when I want to do it!"

That is not the case in God's eyes. His truth still stands. He still says, "You vowed it...you keep it." God in this is saying that promises and vows honorably made, are to be honorably kept. He is saying that they are the very source of honorable action.

Reflect for a moment upon the commitments, the promises, the vows that you have made to God. The vows of faithfulness to His word, to His worship, to moral purity, to good works, to marriage — these are all vows to God. God believed you when you made those vows and God has not forgotten. God is calling upon each of us in our relationship with Him. He is urging each of us, "Keep Your Word!" -Ron Bryant
