TERRIBLE TIMES

The apostle Paul wrote: "But mark this: There will be terrible times in the last days. People will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boastful, proud, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, without love, unforgiving, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not lovers of the good, treacherous, rash, conceited, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God --- having a form of godliness but denying its power. Have nothing to do with them" (2 Timothy 3:1-5 NIV).

We live in a "religious" nation. Yet, religion often seems to have little impact on lives. It has outward form or expression in words and rituals, but no real substance in terms of changing hearts and lives. Paul's words seem almost prophetic of today.

In many ways, these are terrible times. We have seen a moral decline of monstrous proportions in recent decades. Homosexuality has become normal and acceptable in the eyes of many. Abortion (the murder of the unborn) has destroyed millions of children and continues to do so each year. Euthanasia, the murder of the aged, sickly and deformed is not far off. Kids are being abused and neglected as never before. Crime is everywhere. Drugs and alcohol are destroying lives in record numbers. Gambling is common-place. There is a feeling that Christianity has failed. People are turning to the occult for answers.

But, all is not lost! Americans are beginning to mobilize. There are signs that we may be coming to our senses. By way of illustration, more and more people are getting involved in efforts to non-violently and legally protest the killing of the unborn. The number of those who oppose abortion is on the increase. There are signs that the family is becoming more important. And, although mainline Protestant churches are in decline, groups which are seeking a return to the Bible are taking root in many places. We cannot be silent any longer. The voices for decency and morality must be heard. We must turn the tide, and we will if we are willing to take a stand. The time to begin is now!
