Impossible Silence

We should be thankful for their decision. As H. G. Wells once said. "The trouble with so many people is that the voice of their neighbors sounds louder in their ears than the voice of God,"

Remember the conduct of the early Christians when they were being persecuted for their faith. They were scattered abroad, but they were not silent. They "went about preaching the word" (Acts 8:4). We, too, need to understand that we are associated with God in a divine purpose and "we cannot but speak the things we have seen and heard." - John Gipson
