- 3. **IT HARDENS THE HEART.** "The deceitfulness of sin," the Hebrew writer contends, "will ultimately harden the heart" (3:13).
- 4. **IT DESTROYS.** Paul warns that sin destroys the soul now and forever (1 Tim. 5:6; Rom. 6:23).
