What things are really important to you? We know what the answer ought to be, but let's dig deeper than that. Three criteria will demonstrate what really matters to us:

What Really Matters To You?

TIME: All of us have equal amounts of this commodity. Every day we spend every second we have. The question is, how do we spend it? Governor Felix wanted to wait until "a convenient time" to bring his life into harmony with God's will (Acts 24:25). Too often we, like Felix, relegate God to the back burner while we spend our time doing as we please. Countless things compete for our time; job, family, school, innumerable forms of entertainment, community activities - many of these are legitimate, but where does God fit in? We spend time on things that are important to us.

MONEY: Jesus said, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21). I never cared about the stock market until, in the mid 1960s, my class at school invested in a company as part of a project. My share probably wasn't more than two or three dollars, but I went home every afternoon, found the newspaper page for the New York Stock exchange, and observed how "my" company had performed. (In case you're interested, we lost money!)

Investing not only sparks interest, it also demonstrates interest. Haggai rebuked God's people because they were spending money on their own dwellings, but leaving the temple of God in ruins (1:4). They were more interested in creature comforts than in serving God. As with time, we can find endless places and ways to spend money. What is important to you? To find the real answer, look where you spend your money!

CONVERSATION: We talk about things that interest or concern us. "Out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks" (Matthew 12:34). It is next to impossible to hold a conversation on a topic that doesn't interest you, or about which you know very little. We will make the effort to become informed in areas that are important to us.

Do we talk much about Jesus, the Bible, the church, etc., other than when we're together at the meeting house? Some can name every player on their favorite sports team, but can't name the twelve apostles! They know the numbers on the jerseys, but can't remember where key Bible passages are found. They can hold a lively conversation about the last game, what went right, and what went wrong; but they can't show a lost soul the Bible passages that teach how to be saved. What is important to you? Whatever you talk about.

Time, money, and conversation are three criteria by which we can discern what things are truly important to us. Let's examine ourselves honestly, and then make whatever changes are needed.
