## Seven Wonders of the Word

Psalm 119:161

I am impressed with the following seven wonders of the Word.

- 1. The wonder of its *INSPIRATION*! Not just part of it not just the thoughts of it, but "all scripture is given by inspiration of God" (2 Timothy 3:16). To the very jot (tiniest letter) and tittle (tiniest projection which distinguishes one letter from another), it is inspired (Matthew 5:18).
- 2. The wonder of its **FORMATION**! It didn't all come at once but over a period of some 1,600 years, "precept upon precept; line upon line; here a little, there a little" (Isaiah 28:10).
- 3. The wonder of its *UNIFICATION*! It is a library of 66 books, yet ONE BOOK. Written by some 40 writers over approximately 1,600 years, yet ONE MESSAGE (Revelation 19:10).
- 4. The wonder of its **REVELATION**! The Bible is the complete, final revelation of "the things of God" (1 Corinthians 2:10-12) which came not by "the will of man" but as holy men of God were "moved by the Holy Spirit" (2 Peter 1:20-21).
- 5. The wonder of its **INFORMATION!** It is the greatest literature in the world, but it is more, it contains "all things that pertain to life godliness" (2 Peter 1:3). No additional information is needed for it sufficiently equips man for every good work (2 Timothy 3:17).
- 6. The wonder of its **PROPAGATION**! Read by all nations, classes and races. It is the world's best seller, the world's greatest book!
- 7. The wonder of its **PRESERVATION**! The most hated of all books, yet it continues! "The word of the Lord endures forever" (1 Peter 1:25).
