The Greatest!

Jesus is the greatest personality the world has ever known. Although He never wrote a book; yet, the greatest book ever written was written about Him — the Bible. He never commanded an army or a navy and He never sought political power. He was not known for being a world traveler. In the land where He lived while on earth, going east or west, He never traveled more than 50 to 75 miles. Going north or south He never traveled more than 125 - 150 miles except when He, as an infant, was taken to Egypt.

Jesus has been described as a "Master Teacher." As the Master, He employed several methods of teaching. Frequently, He used parables. On one occasion, He said that the kingdom was like a fishing net. You cast the net and you will find some good and some bad fish. The kingdom is like that, you will have some good and bad people.

At other times, He used object lessons. When a question was brought up about paying tribute to Caesar, Jesus asked for a coin and using the coin, He taught that man is to meet his obligation to both Caesar (government) and God. In other words, you can give to Caesar and give to God at the same time. Jesus also taught by asking questions. There are more than 1,000 questions in the New Testament. For example, Jesus asked His disciples, in Matthew 16:13, "Who do people say that the son of Man is?" Jesus was not looking for information; it was a leading question.

We are going to meet Jesus face to face one day. If we live and die in rebellion to His will, we will be lost eternally. If we yield and are submissive to His will, He will walk with us every step of the way. Christ is tough on rebels but sweet with the surrendered. Romans 11:22 sums it up: "Behold the goodness and the severity of the Lord."

We are all going to die. When that day comes, who do you want to meet — a tough Lord or one who opens His arms wide and clasps you to His bosom and loves you forever? There is just one Jesus. He is the greatest! The personality we meet depends on our attitude and disposition. You have to decide.

TRUTH: THE KEY TO FREEDOM

To the Jews who had believed Him, Jesus said, "If you hold to my teachings, you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free" (John 8:31, 32).

Like Pilate, many ask, "What is truth?" God's Word is truth (John 17:17). Jesus is truth (John 14:6). When we know God's Word (the written word and the living Word), we experience real freedom. Truth is absolute. Whatever the circumstance, whatever the culture, whatever the specific situation, truth is truth. Period.

The mighty message of truth must not be confused with the weak vessels who proclaim it. Truth is truth, no matter who speaks it.

Truth is consistent. Human interpretations are not. Human applications may not be. But the truth never changes. When our views and God's truth collide, we must be willing to admit our error and change our outlook to coincide with the Father's. Too often, we attempt to distort God's Word and make it fit our position. Then we become slaves to our own interpretations.

In order to appreciate and enjoy the freedom we have in Christ, we must know Jesus — the living Word and the ultimate Truth.
