- 3. IT IS JUST. God's judgment will be based on His Word (John 12:48), and our actions (Eccl. 12:13, 14).
- 4. IT IS FINAL. The time for plea bargains will be past. His "depart from me" will be final. "Behold, now is the day of salvation" (2 Cor. 6:2).
