5. "And our bodies washed with pure water."

God calls for purity of life. The baptized believer is washed in the blood of the Lamb and knows that a clean life and effective worship go together (Romans 12:1).

The next time you're tempted to say, "I don't get anything from the worship," read Hebrews 10:22 and ask yourself, "What do I bring to it?"
